A Message from Mayor Pete Scirrotto

"As many of you are aware, the Township faced a devastating loss to 5 of our trash trucks as a result of an electrical fire in a trash truck located in the Public Works yard. We are thankful and fortunate that no one was hurt, however, we were left with no resources to collect trash and recycling within our Township. While the fire was still burning, our Superintendent of Public Works, Steve Alexander was reaching out to other towns in the County who may be able to lend a hand with loaning us a truck.

Thanks to the leadership of the Public Works Department and to our employees who rallied behind us we were able to work through the challenges of continuing trash/recycling collection with limited resources. We are so very lucky to have friends and good neighbors in Logan, Westville, Monroe and West Deptford Township who came through with loaners trucks that allowed us to continue our services with little to no delays. We cannot thank them enough for their generosity and willingness to come to our rescue. We also want to thank all the fire crews who quickly responded to the fire ultimately saving many other assets on site.

And lastly, the Township Committee and I would like to thank our residents for your patience during the first couple weeks while we were switching trucks and manging routes as quickly as possible to keep on schedule with pickups. In the interim, the Township is currently renting trucks while we wait for replacement vehicles to be delivered.

Meeting the Needs of our Residents

Mantua Township values our residents and we are constantly trying to improve our performance and meet the expectations of our customers.

With that being said, we have taken the following five actions to be more customer friendly and to better serve our residents. 1. Customer parking signs were placed out front of the Construction entrance door as well as in the Municipal Building parking lot. Thank you to the resident who asked for parking closer to the entrance. 2. Implemented new software to accept credit/debit cards for payments. 3. The phone system was improved to allow for a live person to direct your call simply by pressing zero. 4. All Departments were provided a two-day class on customer service training to strengthen and improve communication and customer service skills. 5. The convenience center at Public Works is now open every Saturday from 10-2 instead of once a month.

We are asking for your feedback on the Township's customer service and your experience interacting with Township employees. If you have recently been in contact with our staff- either by phone, email or in-person, we ask that you take 5 minutes to complete our short customer service survey which you will find on our Township website or can be found at the service counters in the Municipal Building. Mantua Drinking Water Improvements

The Mantua MUA recently completed drinking water improvements that are being funded with approximately \$2.7 million in loans from the NJ Water Bank, a joint low-rate funding program of the DEP and the NJ I-Bank. Total savings for this project are estimated to be \$864,374 over the 20-year term of the loan or 32% of the total project cost. In addition, this project created an estimated 26 direct construction jobs. Improvements included the construction of a new well and new well building with the required electrical, mechanical and control infrastructure including an emergency generator and an upgraded SCADA system. In addition, the project included the rehabilitation of a 0.5-million gallon water storage tower. Based on the most recent inspection reports, the coating on the tank had reached the end of its lifecycle. Improvements to the water storage tank included blasting, spot grinding, filling, welding and painting the tank.
