After the devastating attacks in Ulvade, Mayor Scirotto asked the community leaders from Mantua Township, Harrison Township, and the Borough of Wenonah to come together to discuss implementing new school safety and security initiatives."

The subcommittee has met three times over the summer, and on July 27th, the elected officials collectively mailed a letter to the 5th Legislative District seeking additional state funding to help execute preventive action plans and minimize future safety threats in our schools.

By working together, the three municipalities attempt to share resources, funding, and services in order to better protect our children in our local schools.

The butterfly garden will be formally renovated with new plantings this upcoming Fall and Spring of 2023. After consulting with the Gloucester County Master Gardeners, we plan to cut back the overgrowth and create a more manageable and self-sustaining butterfly garden to attract a wider variety of butterflies.



911 MEMORIAL IMPROVEMENTS

Our peaceful, 9/11 memorial is a place to reflect and dedicate time to remember the fallen victims of the 9/11 attack. Over the summer, the following improvements were made to the memorial.

- Rebuilt the Shanksville Monument Area

HELP IMPROVE OUR WATER QUALITY

Stormwater Management is an effort to reduce runoff of rainwater or melted snow into streets, lawns, and other sites to improve overall water quality. Please remember that what goes in our drains travels directly into our streams and waterways. Do not dump waste into road drains because it can affect our water quality.



HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP- OFF

The Township will not pick up any hazardous or combustible waste. Please take all your hazardous waste products to the next Gloucester Co. Household Special Waste Collection Drop-Off Day.

Any product which is labeled "warning, caution, poisonous, toxic, flammable, corrosive, reactive or explosive" is considered hazardous waste. This includes household products containing toxic chemicals, ammunition, paint, pesticides, herbicides, turpentine, lighter fluid, photographic and pool chemicals, rat poisons, car batteries and other hazardous materials.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR POLICE CHIEF

The Mantua Township Police Department has experienced many recent changes, primarily with staffing resulting from a larger wave of retirements. The retirements have also led to the promotion of Lt. Bill Murphy at the May committee meeting followed by Sgt. Jason Lipsett, Cpl. William Donovan, Cpl. Cody Mroz, and Cpl. Salvatore Oldrati. We take great pride in our promotional and selection processes, and we aim to hire and promote the best people possible.

As we replace vehicles, we are working to eliminate the subdued logos on the black police vehicles that have become so popular over the



last ten years. We are now including a reference to Wenonah while making our vehicles' logos more recognizable and approachable to our residents.

Every year, individuals walk around checking car door handles to find unlocked cars. Generally, these individuals take small items of value. Scams targeting seniors have also become more prevalent."


